Diabetes mellitus is defined as a group of metabolic diseases characterized by hyperglycemia resulting from defects in insulin secretion from the pancreatic beta cells; resistance to insulin action at the level of skeletal muscle, liver, and fat; or both. The resultant hyperglycemia, if untreated, can lead to long-term vascular complications. Thirty million people in the United States are diagnosed with diabetes, and that number is expected to increase to 39 million people by 2050. Thus, millions of people require glucose-lowering therapies to maintain normal glucose levels (normoglycemia) and prevent diabetes complications. Type 1 diabetes, which accounts for 5 to 10 percent of all diabetes cases, is characterized by insulin deficiency and a need for daily insulin administration to sustain life, maintain normoglycemia, and maintain normal body weight and promote normal growth and development in children. Type 2 diabetes, which accounts for 90 to 95 percent of diabetes in the United States, is the result of a combination of insulin resistance and impaired insulin secretion by the beta cells of the endocrine pancreas. Eventually, beta cell failure can lead to insulin deficiency,...
