

Luray and the Shenandoah Valley, with their distinctive geographical, economical, architectural, and cultural history can boast of its own discrete southern identity. The book reveals how African-American texts and history reveal contributions to the town of Luray and the Shenandoah Valley region. The book studies the OI Slave Auction Block, a controversial public history site that subverts the white, hegemonic heritage of the town. **Sustaining Identity, Recapturing Heritage** is groundbreaking in its study of African-American tourism.
